Recognizing that there was a need for formal education in the field of investor relations, CIRI developed a flexible online and in-person program with the Ivey Business School covering all relevant areas of this multi-disciplinary role, including capital markets, corporate governance, securities law, finance and communications. Once individuals successfully complete the program, they are required to write an exam (administered by CIRI) to attain the Certified Professional in Investor Relations (CPIR) designation.

"Investor relations plays a critical role for all public companies where IROs are required to leverage their knowledge in a wide range of disciplines. IROs are a direct reflection of their management team and their Board of Directors, and this program further develops essential skills and knowledge needed in investor relations," continued Ms. Lokker.

CIRI will recognize those who hold the CPIR designation, including those who achieved it in 2017, by hosting a Market Open Ceremony at the TMX Broadcast Centre on Monday, January 8, 2018.
